### **Administrative Information**

**Biographical Sketch** Judith A. Bluestein was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, on April 2, 1948. She attended the University of Pennsylvania, earning a degree in Classics in 1969. In 1973, she received a Master of Arts in Religion (New Testament and Christian Origins) and a Master of Arts in Latin from Case Western University. From 1973-1979, she taught Latin at Walnut Hills High School in Cincinnati.

In 1984, Bluestein was ordained a rabbi and earned a Master of Hebrew Literature and Master of Philosophy in Hebraic and Cognate Studies at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR). She also received a Master of Education from Xavier University in 1984.

In 1990, Rabbi Bluestein began her appointment as Mississippi's first full-time female rabbi when hired by Temple B'nai Israel in Hattiesburg. While a rabbi in Hattiesburg, she served on the Board of the Sunrise Rotary and as an officer in the Hattiesburg Interfaith Alliance, the University of Southern Mississippi Campus Ministers, and the Dream Religious Community Task Force.

During her career, she served congregations in Greenville, Mississippi; Marion, Ohio; Ames, Iowa; Joplin, Missouri; Springfield, Ohio; Flagstaff, Arizona; Quincy, Illinois; and Galesburg, Illinois.

A member of the Greater Cincinnati Board of Rabbis, Rabbi Bluestein was active in the Cincinnati Council for Soviet Jews and the Dayton Christian-Jewish Dialogue. She chaired the Interfaith Plea for Soviet Jews in 1986 and participated in the steering committee for the Interfaith Service for World Peace at the Peace Bell in Newport, Kentucky.

In addition to rabbinical duties, Bluestein taught at HUC-JIR, Xavier University, the University of Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky University, Indiana University, Denison University and the University of Dayton.

In 2009, she received a Doctor of Divinity, honoris causa, from HUC-JIR.

Judith Bluestein died on May 29, 2014.
