Biographical Sketch Heinrich Zirndorf (1829-1893), a poet and rabbinical scholar, was born in Furth, Bavaria and later

emigrated to Cincinnati. He was a rabbi at Temple Beth-El in Detroit, Michigan and later at Ahabath Achim in Cincinnati, Ohio. Zirndorf was also a history professor at Hebrew Union College and an editor of Die

Deborah.

Scope and Content Collection contains correspondence, notebooks, writings, and scrapbooks. Much of the correspondence

relates to Hebrew Union College as well as articles from the American Israelite concerning Russian

refugees.
