Administrative Information

Biographical Sketch Alexander S. Kohanski was born in Vilkavishkis, Lithuania on 4 July 1902 to Samuel and Hannah

(Kolekandt) Kohanski. He moved to the United States in 1923 and received his B.A. from

Southeastern University in 1927. By 1928, Kohanski had earned his M.A. and in 1936 received a Ph.D.

in philosophy from Vanderbilt University.

In 1933, Kohanski earned a certificate in social work which he put to use as an executive director of the YMHA in White Plains, New York and later Washington Heights, New York and New Jersey.

Kohanski served for most of his career as an instructor at the Graduate School for Jewish Social work but had a variety of other activities and interests. He was a contributor to the Universal Jewish Encyclopedia and the Philately and Princeton Seminary Bulletin. Kohanski was also the managing editor of the Jewish Social Services Quarterly. Additionally, he served on the Maine Jewish Council, the Religious Education Association, the American Jewish Conference and League for Labor Palestine.

Kohanski married Dorothy Deller on 9 March 1949. They had two sons, Daniel and Ronald.

Chaim Nachman Bialik, Martin Buber, Theodor Herzl, Jewish education, and the Yiddish theater in New York City; together with materials of a Jewish writers project concerning rituals and procedures at
