## Administrative Information

**Biographical Sketch** J. Victor Greenebaum was born in Cincinnati in 1885. He was educated at Harvard College and received his MD degree from Harvard Medical School in 1911. He joined the staff of Jewish Hospital in Cincinnati in 1914, and served as the hospital's director of pediatrics from 1921-1948. He also served on the Board of Governors of Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, and was an honorary board member at the time of his death, July 25, 1972.

**Scope and Content** Collection consists mainly of correspondence and reports dealing primarily with Greenebaum's activities on the Board of Governors of Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion and his interest in the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Of special interest is his committee work, including work on Hygiene, Scholarship, Library, Museum committees and his correspondence with Julian Morgenstern, Maurice N. Eisendrath, and Gertrude Pinsky (concerning Rabbi Helmut Gins, a German refugee of La Paz, Bolivia).
