Biographical Sketch	Born in Boston, August 3, 1894, Dr. Leo Kallen was a pioneer in the study of voice pathology. He graduated from Harvard in 1916 with a BS degree, and earned his MD from Tufts Medical College in 1925. He practiced in New York City.
Scope and Content	Collection consists of Dr. Kallen's notebooks and writings on voice, speech, and sound, including analysis and diagnosis of illnesses of the voice and methods of treatment. Also includes biographical material, correspondence, photographs, poetry, music, and miscellaneous items.
