<b>Biographical Sketch</b>	Moses P. Jacobson was born in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1864. He received his rabbinic ordination in 1886 from Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati and served as a congregational rabbi in many cities throughout his career, most notably in Shreveport, Louisiana and Asheville, North Carolina. Jacobson died in 1945.
<b>Scope and Content</b>	Collection consisting of sermons, addresses, confirmation programs, correspondence and miscellaneous items.
