#### **Administrative Information**

**Biographical Sketch** Rabbi and author, Bernhard Felsenthal was born in Muenchweiler, near Kaiserslautern,

Germany on January 2, 1822. He was educated in Kaiserslautern and Munich, then taught for a decade in a small Jewish congregational school. In 1854 he emigrated to the United States. He was rabbi and teacher in Madison, Indiana for three years. In 1858 he moved to Chicago, Illinois and was employed by a bank. He participated in the founding and early development of Chicago's Sinai Congregation and became its first rabbi in 1861. In 1864 Felsenthal declined reelection and became rabbi of newly founded Zion Congregation in West Chicago, where he remained for 23 years. In 1887 he was elected rabbi emeritus and retired to the life of a scholar. Felsenthal was an early champion of reform Judaism and also an early advocate of Zionism. He advocated the foundation of the American Jewish Historical Society; and as a corresponding member of the Chicago Historical Society he read a paper concerning the

Israelites of Chicago in 1863. Felsenthal died in Chicago on January 12, 1908.
