Biographical Sketch Leonard A. Greenberg was born in New York City in 1919. He was ordained from Hebrew Union

College in 1943 and temporarily took over the pulpit at Temple Israel in New Rochelle, New York for Jacob Shankman, who was serving as a chaplain. Greenberg later served as both the Hillel Foundation director in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1946-47, with congregations at both Tufts University and

Simmons College. He later moved to California and served in several congregations.

Greenberg has a strong interest in American Jewish history as both a writer and a teacher of outreach

classes.

Leonard married Blanche Gootkin in April 1946. She passed away in 1987.

Scope and Content These papers describe the activities, research interests and publications of Rabbi Leonard A.

Greenberg between 1939-1957. The collection contains correspondence re: organizations, the HUC Monthly, research about Charles Coughlin and antisemitism, and manuscripts about Jewish history.

Arrangement Organized into two (2) series: A. Correspondence/Research Files; B. Writings.
