

Biographical Sketch In 1864, the Hebrew Benevolent Association was formed to provide a burial place for Civil War soldiers.

This became the first organization of Knoxville Jewry. The Association joined the Union of American

Hebrew Congregations in 1875, and voted to become a congregation in 1877, naming themselves Beth El.
