Biographical Sketch Rabbi, communal and civic leader in Rochester, N.Y., Wolf was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, June 15, 1885. He

was ordained at Hebrew Union College and subsequently served on the New York State Conference of Charities and Corrections, as a field worker for the Jewish Welfare Board, and on the Joint Distribution

Committee. He died in Rochester, February 17, 1927.

Jewish Ethics and Social Justice (1920).
