Scope and Content

The collection consists of letters written to Max Cantor and Becky Freedland Cantor between the years 1909 and 1922. The collection is comprised of correspondence between Max and Becky, Max and various family members, Becky and Sam Selmanoff, Becky and family members, and Max's business correspondence. Because the vast majority of letters are not written in English, information regarding the correspondents and date of the letter are taken from the envelope in which the letter was sent. The majority of the correspondence is written in Yiddish. The collection also includes some correspondence written in an unidentified East European language and in English. Max wrote letters in all three languages, while Becky wrote letters primarily in Yiddish. Also included in the collection are cards of various types. Of particular interest are the tiny Jewish New Year's cards, and the "Suffragette Madonna" postcard.

The Cantors were well-traveled, before and after their marriage. Addresses found on the envelopes within the collection include Kansas City, Kansas; Minneapolis, Minnesota; Cleveland, Ohio; Denver, Colorado; and, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. For a time, Becky's address was London, England. Max's family lived in New York City.
