#### **Biographical Sketch**

Robert Philip Tabak was born in 1950 in Dubuque, Iowa. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a master's degree in religion (1977) and a doctorate in history (1990) from Temple University, and was ordained by the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College in 1977.

Tabak has served numerous congregations including Congregation Adath Shalom in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (1977-1979), Beacon Hebrew Alliance in Beacon, New York (1979-1982), Temple Beth Am in Henrietta, New York (1982-1986), Kehillat Israel in Lansing, Michigan (1986-1987), Temple Beth Shalom in Spokane, Washington (1988-1990), Congregation B'nai Shalom in Piscataway, New Jersey (1990-1991), and Beth Israel Congregation in Woodbury, New Jersey (2000-2005). He is also a staff chaplain at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania.

Tabak has been active in the Northern Federation of Temple Youth (NoFTY president, 1967-1968), Reconstructionist Rabbinical Association (editor of the RRA Connection since 2002), National Association of Jewish Chaplains, the Board of Rabbis of Greater Philadelphia (associate director, 1990-1998), and New Jewish Agenda as well as many other local organizations.

Robert Tabak and Ruth Loew married in 1983 and have three sons, Gabriel, Aaron, and Nathan.

## **Scope and Content**

The collection consists of correspondence, writings, and publications created while Tabak was a student, rabbi, chaplain, educator, and member of various Jewish organizations. Rabbinical files include newsletters and programs from the congregations he served. Tabak's work on the code of ethics for the National Association of Jewish Chaplains, the Reconstructionist Rabbinical Association, and Board of Rabbis of Greater Philadelphia is also documented.
