## Administrative Information

**Biographical Sketch** Albert Maimon Shulman was born in Nemirov, Russia on March 21, 1902 to Morris and Rachel Shulman. His family came to the United States in 1904. He received a bachelor's degree from the University of Southern California in 1926 and a Master's degree from the same in 1927. Shulman then attended the Jewish Institute of Religion where he was ordained a rabbi in 1932. He was awarded an honorary doctorate from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in 1960.

After ordination, he became rabbi at Temple Beth-El in South Bend, Indiana. In 1943, he joined the United States Navy and served as a chaplain throughout the war.

Shulman published two books: Religious Heritage of America and Gateway to Judaism.

**Scope and Content** Collection consists primarily of Shulman's writings, which mostly include unpublished manuscripts of anthologies based on numbers in Jewish history and literature. These undated manuscripts sometimes consist of multiple iterations. Also included is correspondence regarding Shulman's two published works: Religious Heritage of America and Gateway to Judaism.

**Arrangement** This collection is arranged in one (1) series: A. General.

**Terms of Access** The collection is open for use; no restrictions apply.
